# **DIRECTORS' REPORT**

## FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2014

The directors present their report for the year ended 31st December 2014.

## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

## • Legal Status and Constitution

The company was incorporated on 12th June 2012 as a private company limited by guarantee, registered number 08104504. On 28th August 2012, the company was recognised as a charity by the Charity Commission, registered number 1148736.

#### Directors Appointment and Training

Directors will be recruited and appointed as and when required by the remaining directors, based on any necessary background or expertise.

New directors will be inducted by the other directors and encouraged to attend relevant training courses where considered beneficial.

#### • Management of the Company

Of the six directors appointed on incorporation five continued to act throughout the year.

During the year, the Board of Directors met on five occasions. Attendance averaged 80%.

The day to day administration is undertaken by K M Caird.

#### Risk Management

The directors continually review the major risks to which the company is exposed and are satisfied that systems and insurance are in place to mitigate their exposure to major risk.

#### **OBJECTS AND ACTIVITIES**

- The objects of the company continue to be as follows:
  - To promote for the benefit of the inhabitants of Lurgashall and the surrounding area the provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, financial hardship or social or economic circumstances or for the public at large in the interests of social welfare and with the object of improving the condition of life of the said inhabitants.

#### **OBJECTS AND ACTIVITIES (continued)**

- The objectives for the year were:
  - o to improve the appearance of the Football Field, now renamed the Jubilee Field and then to maintain it.
  - o to consider possible future uses for the field.

#### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Achievement of Objectives and Public Benefit

- o The field has been renamed "The Jubilee Field" in honour of HM The Queen, during whose jubilee celebrations the work leading up to the purchase was carried out.
- Since completion of the purchase, in July 2013, work to the entrance and hedges has been carried out, as well as more regular maintenance of the grass areas, thereby improving the overall appearance of the field.
- In June 2014, the Board submitted a planning application to South Downs National Park for the installation of a hard surface parking area. The principal purpose of this was to explore what, if any, construction and/or alternative uses could be installed in the Field. Although the application was subsequently withdrawn, by then the Board had obtained considerable guidance as to future uses, and is grateful for the constructive and helpful comments which the statutory authorities provided during this process.
- O In planning the activities for the year the directors have referred to guidance contained in the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. In particular the directors consider how the planned activities contribute to the aims and objectives of the charitable company and are satisfied that this is the case.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

#### Results for the year

After the major fund-raising which occurred in 2013, 2014 was a quiet year financially by comparison. Attracting subscriptions from members was the major financial event, and the year ended with a total of 181 members, of which 30 are juniors.

The Board decided to increase the expenditure on field maintenance, in part recognising that the field had suffered neglect in the past.

At the year-end, unrestricted reserves amounted to £23,936 (2013: £24,138), predominantly represented by its Bank balance.

## • Liability of Members

In accordance with the Company's Articles, the liability of any member is restricted to a maximum of £10 in the event of the dissolution of the company.

#### Reserves Policy

The directors aim to have sufficient reserves to fund the maintenance of the freehold land.

#### **FUTURE ACTIVITIES**

The company will continue to maintain The Jubilee Field for the benefit of the inhabitants of Lurgashall and the surrounding area, as well as explore opinions for additional uses for the field.

#### DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES IN RELATION TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The directors are responsible for preparing the report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice). Company law and the law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, for the financial period. In preparing these financial statements the directors are required to

- Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- Observe the methods and principles of the Charities SORP;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements, and
- Prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue its activities.

The directors are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006 and the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### 8. TAXATION

The company is a registered charity and is potentially exempt from taxation in respect of income and capital gains received within the categories covered by Section 505 of the Taxes Act 1988 or Section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992, to the extent that such income or gains are applied exclusively to charitable purposes.
